

Coyotes are essential to the ecosystem as rodent control, scavengers, and so much more. They are also the most targeted species in wildlife killing contests across the country.

Project Coyote cofounded the National Coalition to End Wildlife Killing Contests comprised of more than 50 national and state wildlife conservation organizations working together to bring an end to these cruel and senseless killings nationwide. Seven states have made those illegal. Illinois has one of the biggest killing contests in the US.

Join captain Benicio Becka in meeting with and writing to our state legislators urging them to make wildlife killing contests illegal in Illinois.
