Fran (Feuer) Deken

Class of 1961



Fran Feuer Wolf Deken is a professional bowler recognized for her service and leadership in the sport. She represented the United States at the 2001 and 2005 Maccabiah Games in Israel as captain and bowler on the women's team, winning medals in singles, doubles, team, trios and all events and was awarded the Yetty Bennett Sportsman Award in 2001. She also participated in the 2003 Pan American Maccabiah Games in Santiago, Chile and bowled the British Open, finishing in the top eight and was third in the Malta Senior Open.

Deken is a past president and board member of the Bowling Writers Association of America and winner of their Hennessey Award of Merit in 2016. She has been inducted into the following Halls of Fame: United States Bowling Congress (for service), Professional Women Bowlers Association (service), Southern Nevada (skill), Tulsa Area (skill), Oklahoma State (skill), Greater Kansas City (skill), and Kansas State (skill).

While at New Trier, Deken was extremely active in GAA. Her after school sports were soccer, field hockey, volleyball, basketball, and softball, but aside from all that she still had time for bowling on the weekends. She began bowling at age 10 at the Winnetka Community House and continues to bowl leagues to this day. Deken bowled competitively for the University of Iowa for 4 years, winning national titles in 1962 and 1964. She became a professional bowler in 1973 after her first husband passed away. She bowled the tour off and on for 7 years while raising two sons.


When the tour needed help with media, Deken volunteered to write press releases (not too difficult for an English major). She realized that she was not a top player but could still contribute with her ability to lead and organize. She became the national tournament director for the Professional Women Bowlers Association in 1981 and has been involved with them ever since, currently as their historian. This has led to volunteer work as a member of the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame Committee (served as chair 2012-2014) and the PWBA Hall of Fame committee, where she still serves on both. Deken also volunteered to become a member of the board of her local bowling association in 2006 and still continues that activity. She was hired to be Association Manager for the Oklahoma State Bowling Association in 2017, a part-time job she still enjoys, running several statewide tournaments each year and handling the organization's financial duties.

Deken says her greatest achievement is her two sons, Paul and Charles Wolf, who are great fathers and great people.



Bruce Dern

Class of 1954



With more than 180 credited roles as a film and television actor, Bruce Dern has a Hollywood career spanning from the 1960s to present day. He was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor for *Coming Home* in 1979 and Best Actor for *Nebraska* in 2014. He was also nominated for an Emmy for *Big Love* in 2011 and a Golden Globe for *Coming Home*. Dern has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame and received several lifetime achievement awards from various film festivals including Cannes. He continues to work into his 80s, with ten projects completed or in the works just in the past three years, including his critically acclaimed role in *The Artist's Wife* in 2020.

John Donahoe

Class of 1978



After having served on Nike's Board of Directors for six years, John Donahoe joined Nike as CEO in January 2020 to grow the Nike brand as well as Nike's global business portfolio.

Previously, he was president and CEO for ServiceNow and eBay. Earlier in his career, Donahoe worked for Bain & Company for almost 20 years, becoming the firm's CEO in 1999. A former basketball player and lifelong sports fan, he received an MBA from Stanford Graduate School of Business and the Ernest C. Arbuckle Award, which recognizes excellence in management leadership.



Justin Niebank

Class of 1974



Growing up in Glencoe Illinois, Justin Niebank began studying classical music while in grade school. He continued playing music throughout his time at New Trier East High School. After graduating from Ripon College in 1978, Niebank embarked on a career in popular music.

At first, Niebank was committed to being a performing artist but in time discovered the lifestyle was not to his liking. Luckily, after spending an enormous amount of time in recording studios, he found that the art of recording music was his true calling.

As a musician, recording engineer/producer and mixer, Niebank began making records in the mid 1980s. Splitting his time between Chicago, New York and London, he eventually landed in Nashville, Tennessee.

Since then, Niebank has had the good fortune of working with hundreds of artists that bridge multiple eras and genres: from Johnny Winter to Eric Clapton, Neal Diamond to Bob Seger, Sheryl Crow to Blues Traveler, George Jones to Dolly Parton, Bon Jovi to Steven Tyler, Blake Shelton to Keith Urban, and Vince Gill to Taylor Swift.

Along the way, Niebank has worked on over 200 number one records, has received three Grammys, two CMAs, and eight ACM awards. He also has been recognized with sixteen Music Row Awards (an acknowledgment for the most top ten records in a given year).

With his wife, Kathy, Niebank has for thirty years lived on their farm up a hollow in rural Franklin, Tennessee.

Justin is an avid conservationist and outdoorsman and is a major contributing member of several conservation organizations.



Deborah L. Rhode

Class of 1970

Deborah L. Rhode (1952-2021) was, at the time of her death, the Ernest W. McFarland Professor of Law and the Director of the Center on the Legal Profession at Stanford University.



She was the founding president of the International Association of Legal Ethics, the former president of the Association of American Law Schools, and the former founding director of Stanford's Center on Ethics. She also worked as counsel to the House of Representatives' Judiciary Committee during the impeachment proceedings against President Bill Clinton.

She was the nation's most frequently-cited scholar on legal ethics and the author of 30 books in the fields of professional responsibility, leadership, and gender.



Sharon (Percy) Rockefeller

Class of 1962



Sharon Percy Rockefeller has served the public media community for more than 40 years. She has been President and Chief Executive Officer of WETA, public television and radio and Washington, D.C.'s flagship public media station for 32 years since 1989. In 2018, Mrs. Rockefeller was a recipient of a National Medal of Arts for her extraordinary leadership and advocacy in the arts and public media.

Mrs. Rockefeller grew up in Kenilworth and attended Joseph Sears Elementary School. Following in the footsteps of her father, Senator Charles H. Percy, who graduated from New Trier in 1937, Mrs. Rockefeller was a member of the graduating class of 1962. During her time at New Trier, she ran for class offices with her identical twin sister, Valerie; sang in the New Trier choir; played tennis; spoke fluent French; and has enjoyed lasting friendships with many of her fellow classmates.

Following graduation from New Trier, Mrs. Rockefeller received a B.A. from Stanford University. She remains active in a number of areas including the arts, education, government, and women's issues. She serves on the Board of Trustees of The Museum of Modern Art and is President of the Museum's International Council. She is a recently retired Chairman of the Board of Trustees and Trustee Emeritus, of the National Gallery of Art. She is a member of the Rockefeller Foundation Board and is a Trustee Emeritus of the Johns Hopkins Medicine Board. Mrs. Rockefeller is a member of the National Academy of Medicine President's Advisory Council and a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. She is a member of The Economic Club of Washington, The Dean's Council of the Washington National Cathedral, and a member and former chairman of the Stanford-in-Washington Council. Mrs. Rockefeller is the 2021 recipient of the Foundation for Art & Preservation in Embassies' Annenberg Award. She is also a former member of the boards of PepsiCo., Inc.; Stanford University; the University of Chicago and The George Washington University.

She is married to retired West Virginia Senator John D. "Jay" Rockefeller IV. They have four children and eight grandchildren.



Nancy (Lynch) Scott

Class of 1960



Nancy Lynch Scott has been a trailblazer for women in the traditionally all-male field of investment professionals. She first broke through the glass ceiling in the late 1960s by being one of the first women hired by an all-male Wall Street firm. That experience helped her recognize the need for a safe and comfortable place for women to go for financial help. So, in 1970 Nancy started her own firm. She took it public and served as its president. She was dedicated to hiring and serving women. She co-authored the book, *ALONE*, a guide for the suddenly single woman.

The late 70s took Nancy into the field of commercial real estate development. With the help of a dedicated group of partners, she was able to construct over 20 motels, condos, self-storage complexes and a wind energy farm.

“If you can make it there, you can make it anywhere” usually refers to New York City. Comparing her experiences in the Big Apple and NTHS, Nancy concludes, “Wall Street was hard. New Trier was harder.”

Nancy Lynch grew up in Glencoe, an only child of incredibly supportive parents. She attended Central School where the name “New Trier” was almost magical.

Nancy recalls that “NTHS was big, scary and wonderful. Academics were a real challenge and A’s hard to come by. Extra-curricular activities - a dream come true.” Nancy enjoyed many different sports but found her real passion was in the theater. She enjoyed roles in many productions including the famed Lagniappe. Senior year, she became the editor of *PLAYBACK*, the audio yearbook.

Nancy found no sympathy when she lamented to her favorite teacher, Mrs. Peggy Wingle, “No NYSE Wall Street firm will ever hire a woman.” Mrs. W replied, “Then it’s your job to change that.” She remained Nancy’s trusted pen pal for the next 25 years.

Presently, Nancy enjoys the company of her first love and high school sweetheart, Rear Admiral Michael Scott (NTHS ‘61), and spending time with their growing family. She passionately serves the community through her San Diego Rotary club (the fourth largest in the world).



Richard E. Wiley

Class of 1951

Richard E. Wiley is a Partner in the Washington D.C. law firm of Wiley Rein LLP, with over 250 lawyers and one of the nation's largest communications practice.



A native of Winnetka, Illinois, Dick Wiley (like his two brothers before him) graduated from New Trier High School where, among various activities, he played Varsity Baseball, other team sports, the euphonium horn in the Band and Orchestra and, most of all, enjoyed his challenging Great Books class.

Mr. Wiley later graduated from Northwestern University (B.S. with distinction, and again participating in Varsity Baseball and the University's Bands and Orchestra); Northwestern Law School (J.D.); and Georgetown Law Center (LL.M). After serving as an Officer in the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps at The Pentagon, he returned to Chicago to practice law and teach law school for eight years.

From 1970-77, Dick Wiley served as Chairman, Commissioner and General Counsel of the Federal Communications Commission where he was a leading force in the agency's initial efforts to foster increased competition and lessened regulation in the communications field. He is the only person to have held all three positions. Thereafter, Mr. Wiley was the Managing Partner of Kirkland and Ellis' Washington D.C. Office and, beginning in 1983, of his own law firm. Over some 30 years, he was involved in a host of major communications mergers and acquisitions. And for nearly a decade, he also led pro bono the effort to develop a new digital HDTV transmission standard for our country and received an Emmy for his role.

Dick Wiley has been profiled in numerous publications, including *The New York Times* ("Telecommunications' Ubiquitous Man of Influence"), *Los Angeles Times* ("The Sixth Commissioner"), *International Herald Tribune* ("Most Influential Media Lawyer in the U.S."), *American Lawyer* ("Brand Name of Communications Law"), *Toronto Globe and Mail* ("Father of HDTV"), *D.C. Bar Journal* ("Legend of the Bar"), *Broadcasting and Cable* ("100 Men of the Century"), etc. He also has received many industry awards and chaired a variety of bar associations.



Chad Bernstein

Class of 2002, Young Alumnus Award



Dr. Chad Bernstein is a husband and father of four amazing kids, the Co-Founder/CEO of Guitars Over Guns, and a professional musician who has been instrumental in the evolution of the “Latin Funk” sound of Miami. Through the universal language of music, Chad galvanized the artist community to use music as a bridge to reach and empower our most vulnerable youth.

Chad received a Doctorate of Musical Arts from the University of Miami in 2012, turning the focus of his dissertation to Guitars Over Guns’ research-based methods. This set the stage for Chad and his father, Bob, to collaborate on the organization’s creation in 2008. Today, Guitars Over Guns has a \$2,000,000 budget serving nearly 2,000 students a year in Miami, Chicago, and Los Angeles.

In 2015, Chad was honored as a CNN Hero, and has since been featured on the *Steve Harvey Show* and in *People Magazine*. In 2019, Chad received the Ruth Shack Leadership Award, an honor held in Miami’s highest regard; and in 2020 was named an inaugural recipient of the Elevate Prize, selected from among thousands of global changemakers.

Chad serves as a Governor on the board of the Recording Academy, while remaining one of South Florida’s premier Latin, jazz, and funk artists. He performs with the Latin Grammy-nominated Spam Allstars and Miami-based band ¡Suénalo!, and has worked with Pitbull, Shakira, will.i.am, Natalie Cole, Frank Sinatra, Jr., Chaka Kahn, John Legend, Phil Ramone, Pee Wee Ellis, and Jencarlos Canela, among others.

A proud member of New Trier Class of 2002, Chad’s student life was mostly spent on the third floor of the music wing, participating in Jazz Band, Symphonic Band, Orchestra, Jazz Improv, Pep Band, Lagniappe, and trombone and piano lessons. He fondly remembers the Cultural Immersion trip to China with Jazz 1. When not making music, Chad could be found playing hockey, lacrosse or wrestling. For his Senior Project, Chad recorded his first CD, engineered by fellow New Trier students and featuring science teacher Nick Drozdoff. He is humbled to be named to New Trier’s Alumni Hall of Honor.



Latin Club Project Building Robust Learning




